Ohio residents who hold a current Ohio Driver's License or State ID Card will automatically receive a free card by mail in the month of their 60th birthday. If you have not received a card, or need a replacement, call the number below for assistance or apply at a participating public library or senior center. Take proof of your age, such as a driver's license or birth certificate. An optional Medicare-approved drug discount card is also available for an annual fee.

SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION

To apply for Social Security benefits, contact the Social Security Administration three months before you want your benefits to begin. Retirement benefits may be paid as early as age 62, but at a reduced rate.

Medicare is federal health insurance. It covers a portion of your hospital and doctor bills. When you apply for Social Security benefits at age 65, you are automatically enrolled in Medicare Part A (free hospital insurance). You may also choose to sign up for Medicare Part B (medical insurance).

A monthly premium for Part B will be deducted from your benefit check, unless low income entitles you to Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) or Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB) aid (see page 11).
